Feral Cat Spay & Neuter Guidelines

- We take feral cats on a first come, first serve basis and you must be present. We take the first FIVE feral cats in the morning, Monday-Friday. Doors open at 7 am. There will be a sign-up sheet on a clipboard hanging outside the front of the building.
- 2. You will sign up with your feral cat name/last name. For example Feral #3 Smith.
- 3. Feral cats MUST COME IN A HUMANE TRAP. If they are not in a humane trap, they will not be accepted for surgery. **ONE cat per humane trap.**
- 4. You must sign a surgery consent form for each feral cat.
- 5. You will pick up your feral cat between 4:00-4:30 pm.
- 6. Feral cats **Will Be Ear Tipped** to show they are sterilized. There are no exceptions to this procedure.
- 7. Rabies vaccination is required by state law and will be given to every feral cat with doctor approval.
- 8. If finances allow, please consider these additional procedures to improve the health and quality of life of your feral cat:
 - a. Vaccinating against FVRCP (\$19) and FELV (\$19).
 - b. Testing for Feline Leukemia and Feline AIDS (\$25)
 - c. Deworming for intestinal worms with Profender (\$11-\$17)
 - d. Applying a topical flea/heartworm preventative (\$18.50)
 - e. Cleaning ears and applying ear mite medication if needed (\$25)
 - f. Giving a long-lasting antibiotic injection if needed (Convenia \$12-\$35)
- 9. Feel free to ask our technicians any questions you have about the above policies/procedures.

TRAPS:

If you need to rent a feral trap, you may do so from us with a \$60 deposit. Cash or Check ONLY. You will get your \$60 deposit back as soon as the trap is returned.
